Dear Pastor Amy--

You have probably been notified by ELCA that my service is coming to an end this summer.

Although Global Mission has affirmed the work that we do in Nigeria, they said that it does not align enough with their own mission priorities. They want their missionaries to be working more directly with the local Lutheran church in the country so they decided to phase my position out.

They let me know about this decision in 2016, and I appreciate the long lead-in that they gave us for making this transition. Although my service officially ends July 31, they will continue paying me for 6 months after that.

We are on our way to the U.S. right now for 2 months of home service. We have made up our minds that we're going back to Nigeria. We are too involved in ministry there in order to leave it at this time. We will head back to Nigeria at the beginning of August.

I assume that Global Mission will ask your congregation to support another ELCA missionary.

We are looking into various mission agencies to partner with for our future support. We still have a little time to pull that together. I have accepted a part-time teaching position at our children's school which will help defray their school fees.

We are sincerely grateful to Good Shepherd for your financial support via the ELCA for years. We also appreciate the love and concern that you have shown our family.

We are confident that God will see us through this transition time. Blessings, Mary Beth



## **Good Shepherd's Krumkake Demonstration/Sale at Nordic Fest**

In just 3 ½ weeks, Decorah will be celebrating its Norwegian heritage with the 51<sup>st</sup> anniversary of Nordic Fest (and the invasion of thousands of bikers). Good Shepherd will also be preparing for their annual Krumkake Fest!

Planned by WELCA, the Krumkake demonstration and sale is an **all-congregation event**. Although this project is a fundraising event we've found that it is a wonderful fellowship opportunity for all (families, men, women and children) working together baking, demonstrating and selling those little cone-shaped cookies. Last year 63 individuals, working a total 350 hours on various aspects of this project, shared in making this a successful project (some of these folks worked 2-3 shifts!). All ages are invited to participate and no experience is necessary. This year we will also have our Krumkake available for RAGBRAI coming through town on Friday. We are anticipating a large turnout so will be needing more participation from our members.

### **Preparing Krumkake batter at home**

Recipe & plastic container furnished. Containers and recipes are on the table in Narthex. Please bring your batter to the church the week of July 18.

### **Baking**

9 sessions are planned at **church**, or you may want to bake at **home** or with a friend in your home. Come when you can and work only as long as you want. Bakers and rollers can sit down while working. If you are new to the Krumkake baking experience, we will teach you (very easy to learn).

### CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES, June 20, 2017, 7 P.M.

**Present:** Pr. Amy Larson, Jim Fritz, Megan Buckingham, John Moeller, Anna Norris, Lise Kildegaard, Luther Snow, Amalia Vagts, Reg Laursen and Jeri Laursen.

#### **Preparing our Hearts and Minds to Serve**

**Devotions** were given by Reg Laursen.

**Approval of Minutes of March Council meeting:** R. Laursen moved, Buckingham seconded to approve the minutes as printed in the June newsletter; passed.

**Adoption of the Council meeting Agenda:** J. Laursen moved, Vagts seconded to adopt the agenda; passed.

#### **Old Business:**

Committees were asked to turn in hard copy and digital copy of revisions to their Committee Continuing Resolutions.

Property and Management: Reg Laursen (moved up in the agenda so Laursen could go work on the roof)

Laursen went over the revisions they made in their Continuing Resolutions.

Kinderhaus Proposal: Kinderhaus is currently paying \$320 monthly rent. They propose to increase that to \$575 monthly when they increase their school hours to 3:00 in the fall. R. Laursen moved on behalf of the committee to accept their proposal, no 2<sup>nd</sup> needed; passed. Kinderhaus also requested a summer camp August 14-18 and will pay \$75 for the use of the building. Laursen moved on behalf of the committee to approve their request, no 2<sup>nd</sup> is needed. They will be outside but if the weather is unbearable they may have to use the Fellowship Hall. Pr. Amy noted that funerals take precedence over the Fellowship space. Passed.

Solar is ready to go. One tree will need to be removed by the building as it shades the solar in the late afternoon.

Additional push button locks have been put on the Sacristy and Room 1.

Moss Roofing will begin the reroofing project this week. Pr. Amy has temporarily moved out of her office to the Music Room as major renovation will be taking place in her office ceiling. R. Laursen moved that we go to Decorah Bank and Trust to secure a short term loan up to the amount of \$30,000 to pay bills associated with the roofing and Pr. Amy's office repair. Buckingham seconded; passed.

#### **New Business:**

Vagts brought to the Council a motion from the Stewardship Committee recommending the Council invite a presentation from GSB Fundraising about their Stewardship for All Seasons stewardship program. The idea is that this could be an approach instead of a possible capital campaign. After discussion regarding this motion Snow amended the committee's motion to request a presentation from GSB to the Council to show the pros and cons between Stewardship and Capital campaigns. Buckingham seconded; passed, Vagts abstained. GSB is available to Skype with the Council on July 20 at 7:00. This will be a single item agenda.

Fellowship Coffee: We have been selling LWR Fair Trade Coffee for 15 years. LWR is no longer using that coffee so the committee would like to discontinue ordering from them. Snow requested that our Administrative Assistant order coffee for Fellowship Hour taking social responsibility into account. Buckingham seconded; passed. Fritz will look into a couple possible places to order coffee. Kildegaard will send a Thank You card to Marty Steele and LWR on behalf of the Council.

Education: Anna Norris

The committee is working on background checks for those working with children, Bob Felde is editing the children's safety policy and three people have been approved as drivers. The Education Committee and the staff passed background checks, Heather Cote and Anna Norris have also passed the background checks for drivers.

Evangelism: Lise Kildegaard

The committee has been active. Their next meeting will be Thursday, June 22. They are working on a Nursery update.

Stewardship: Amalia Vagts

The committee continues their work on congregational outreach, stewardship and updating the congregation about the Ministry Teams.

Worship and Music: Luther Snow

The committee is instituting separate Lector/Assistant Minister roles in worship beginning in October. They are beginning to think about the possibility of a second Sunday morning worship service. This service would be identical to the current service.

Pastor's Report: Pr. Amy

Pr. Amy served on the 2017 Synod Assembly Planning Committee and chaired the elections committee. She thanked Jim Fritz, Jane Kemp and Jonathon Struve for serving on the committee. She worked with our social justice sub-committee and people from First Lutheran to bring a resolution about AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities). The resolution was to create an AMMPARO network in our synod. It was approved by the assembly. Pr. Amy reported that she has moved to the Music Room temporarily as her office is being worked on to get rid of the black mold.

Assistant Pastor's Report: Pr. Marion Pruitt-Jefferson submitted a report to the Council.

President: Jim Fritz gave a brief report about the Synod Assembly presentation.

Vice President: Megan Buckingham

The SET committee has been meeting regularly, has done training and is setting up conversations with various groups of the church. They will share results with the Council. Their plan is to do an Adult Forum in September to share feedback.

Treasurer's Report: John Moeller

Moeller asked where the extra money for Flood Buckets should go. Buckingham moved to give remaining money to Lutheran Services in Iowa. Kildegaard seconded; passed.
