Beloved of God,

There is a lot in flux for the congregation! We've thanked Kathryn Thompson for her work and welcomed our new Director of Children, Youth and Family ministry, Kelli Gapinski. Jenny Werner, Administrative Assistant, has announced her retirement date as no later than March 15, 2022, and her willingness to step down whenever her replacement can be found. We have worked to revise the job description for that office position and are close to posting an ad for a Ministry Support Coordinator.

We are also transitioning to recording our in-person worship service and sharing it at 11:30am on YouTube. During our first attempt at this, August 29, there were lots of problems with the sound. We are working on low-cost fixes for this. This spring, the Congregation Council discerned that we need to focus the bulk of our personnel and financial resources on gathering in-person. Our recorded online service is intended to keep worshippers at home connected with an in-person congregation.

We are also welcoming many Luther students to Good Shepherd. During first year orientation weekend, on August 29, we had many students come to worship on "Walk to Church" Sunday. We are in conversation with the new Luther College Pastor, Pr. Melissa Bills, to discern how we can partner with College Ministries to welcome and accompany Luther students.

Fall programming is starting up again as well. Choir and band resume in-person on September 8 (at 7 and 8pm). All vaccinated people are welcome to participate. Rally Sunday, and the start of Sunday School and Youth Forum, is September 12. Confirmation starts September 15.

On Sunday, September 19 and 26, we will engage in racial justice work as a congregation. On September 19, we'll share in conversations that ground us in love for one another and in God's work of justice. On September 26, we will share in conversation around the draft racial justice statement. Please plan to participate in these important conversations. See more in this newsletter and watch for location information.

All of this is happening as the Delta variant surges in our state and county. Our county is in the "red zone" with high levels of Covid transmission. We are adjusting procedures often, as needed, so that we can continue to gather safely, care for one another, and protect our community. These adjustments ask us to practice patience and flexibility. I know we are weary of Covid and weary of patience and flexibility! Yet we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. I am praying with this passage below regularly these days. Let's seek to live this out together!

The service will be recorded and shared on YouTube and KWLC at 11:30am. There will be milestone blessings for students beginning Sunday School and Confirmation. Following worship, all kids 4 yr. old-12th grade will share in fun activities outdoors with Kelli and our Sunday School teachers and helpers.

Parents: As we plan for the fall, we ask that you register for Sunday School and Youth Forum in advance to let us know if your child(ren) will be participating this year. We have a number of new children and youth and want to make sure we have teachers and space for everyone. Please fill out this [online registration form](#) by Friday, September 3. We also need a medical release form filled out by Rally Sunday on September 12. You can print it out from here: [medical release form](#) bring it or mail it to church or you can pick up a hard copy outside the church office. (look above the counter near the office at the cubbies, there is one labeled medical release forms.) Note: If you filled out a medical release form this year for VBS, that form is good through this school year.

Given the surge in Delta in our area, the Congregation Council has updated our COVID protocols to keep with CDC guidance for educational settings and guidance for indoor mask wearing in areas of substantial spread, as is happening in our county. Masks are required indoors for all students and teachers in Sunday School, Youth Forum and Confirmation. We will be outside as much as possible and masks will be optional outdoors. Teachers, Helpers and Worship Leaders are asked to attest to their vaccination status, to Pr. Amy, before working with kids and leading worship.

Youth currently in 8th-12th grade are invited to attend the ELCA Youth Gathering July 23-28, 2022, in Minneapolis, MN. Join others from Good Shepherd and Decorah to experience a fun and energizing faith building experience with 36,000 other high school students from around the country. We'll be traveling with (and able to room with!) friends from Decorah Lutheran, First Lutheran and other area congregations. Kelli Gapinski will accompany Good Shepherd youth.

So, what is the ELCA Youth Gathering? A youth gathering combines...

- 36,000 Lutherans having fun, learning, serving and growing in faith
- epic worship services with great music on a massive scale
- amazing speakers, including many youth speakers, who share powerful stories about their questions, struggles, faith, justice, and God's love
- opportunities to put faith into action through service
- a chance to experience how big and wonderful our ELCA church is
- friendships, new and old, with people from our congregation, Decorah and all over the world
- concerts, dances, hotel time and a fun activity in the twin cities before the gathering
- starts (still to be determined)
- time with a small group and an adult leader to reflect on faith, questions, and life

In total, the trip will be around \$850 (depending on pending housing and transportation costs) and includes programming, transportation, and housing. Transportation and hotel rooms will be with other ELCA congregations in Decorah. Students will be able to choose at least roommate. **Registration and a \$250 non-refundable deposit are due by October 25 (make checks out to Good Shepherd.)** Students are responsible for the \$250 deposit and the cost of meals. Students and adult leaders will be expected to participate in monthly meetings to prepare for the gathering. These meetings will begin November 7th at 7pm at First Lutheran Church.

UPDATED COVID PROTOCOLS

At the August 17 meeting, the Congregation council updated the COVID protocols:

1. Masks are required indoors for all students and teachers in Sunday School, Youth Forum and Confirmation.
2. Teachers and Worship Leaders are asked to attest to their vaccination status before teaching and leading worship.
3. Fellowship hour will move outdoors. The serving table will be set up indoors in the entryway (vestibule) by the kitchen. Servers will remain masked. People will be invited to come through the line indoors and enjoy treats outdoors. Feel free to bring chairs from home to sit and enjoy treats outdoors.

The council has approved these 3 motions by email on 8/26

1. Groups using the Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary can set their own policies about masks and food. Masks and distancing are encouraged.
2. Funeral receptions can be held indoors as long as there are servers who feel comfortable serving at an indoor reception. Ideally, the catered meals will require minimal serving help so that only those who chose to attend will be present. We are doing this with Fellowship Hall policies while also still having Fellowship Hour outside. Fellowship Hour is an important time of gathering for the congregation. We want to be inclusive to unvaccinated kids (who love Fellowship Hour!), those who are immunocompromised, and those who feel uncomfortable serving at an unmasked indoor gathering. For now it is fairly simple to be outside for Fellowship Hour. These policies for the Fellowship Hall allow people to make their own decisions regarding things that aren't central to our congregation.

Again this year we will be collecting items for LWR school kits and baby care kits. City-wide garage sales are this month and if you are a garage sale shopper and need a project, gently used baby items are needed for our kits-cotton t-shirts, baby gowns or sleepers, receiving blankets-medium weight cotton or flannel (not fleece), cotton cloth diapers, jackets, sweaters, baby caps, socks. The Depot is also a good place to shop for these items. Hand towels and 5 oz bars of bath soap are also needed.

School supplies are also being collected. Items included in the kits are 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper, 30 cm ruler, pencil sharpener, blunt scissors, #2 unsharpened pencils, black or blue ballpoint pens, box of 16 or 24 count crayons, 2 ½ " eraser. A Thrivent Action card was used to purchase drawstring backpacks. A donation box for LWR kits will be set up in the church entry.

In October we will be assembling the kits and then taking them to Olson's Explosives and Trucking on Saturday, November 6 from 7:30 am to 10:30 am. Many churches in Northeast Iowa bring their kits and quilts to Olson's for delivery to LWR headquarters in St Paul.

THE GIFT OF THE SPIRIT

Celtic Christians likened the Holy Spirit not to a dove, but to a goose. In these three sessions of the fall *Gather* Bible study, the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith, associate pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Davenport, Iowa, will lead us on our own divine Wild Goose chase. We'll track the Holy Spirit's actions throughout the Bible and throughout our lives. We'll explore how the Spirit moves God's people into adventures and lives we would never dare risk on our own.

Session 1: Spirit of God: Revealer and Resource

The Holy Spirit might be the most misunderstood or mysterious member of the Trinity, but the Spirit of scripture is not shy. Together we'll uncover the bold, truth-telling Spirit active in our lives. After a quick review of the mystery of the Trinity, we'll read parts of Jesus' farewell discourse, and hear how the Spirit continues to reveal the truth of Jesus to us and to the world. Mission Endowment Fund

"Plant your seeds and trust in the Lord that these seeds will bear fruit even when you are gone."

We are truly blessed with the ability to provide financial support to so many Good Shepherd members attending ELCA colleges and universities. Our Mission Endowment Fund allows us to continue this worthy mission.

As a reminder, the Good Shepherd MEF is established to receive memorial, honorary and direct gifts that are invested in perpetuity. That means we can use 4% of the total value of the fund annually to provide scholarships and grants to members of our congregation, while the fund continues to grow. The MEF has provided \$6000 in EPIC scholarships in the past two years. Because our EPIC scholarships receive matching funds from the ELCA institutions, the \$6000 has turned into \$12000 of assistance.

Good Shepherd membership continues to grow. Along with that growth is an increase in young children and teenagers. A survey in 2020 indicated that there were 43 youth, ages 0 to 20. We anticipate that those numbers will continue to increase.

Along with congregational growth, the Mission Endowment Fund needs to grow. Please consider a gift to the Good Shepherd Mission Endowment Fund. It will be a gift that keeps giving for years to come. Brochures were mailed to each family in the congregation in January and are available in the church office or from the pastor.

Lutheran Disaster Response Haiti Crisis

The Situation: A devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck southwest Haiti on Aug. 14. Over 1,400 people were killed, and that number is expected to increase as search-and-rescue efforts continue. Blocked roads are delaying the delivery of vital supplies to hospitals, which are overwhelmed with more than 6,900 injured people. At least 26,000 homes were damaged or destroyed, but the full extent of damage is still unknown. Haiti is also suffering through a political crisis and was hit by Tropical Storm Grace on Monday night, which caused severe flooding in communities already damaged by the earthquake.

Our Response: For over two decades, the ELCA has maintained a presence in southern Haiti through support for agricultural and sustainable development work. To continue our engagement with those communities, Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with partner organizations in the communities to meet relief needs, including food, water, medical supplies and temporary shelter. In the future, other areas of support will include psychosocial care, water and sanitation, and creating sustainable livelihoods through agriculture and livestock. We also stand with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti as it assesses damage and impacts on churches and church life.

What you can do:

Pray: Please pray for the communities affected by the earthquake in Haiti. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need. Pray that God will deliver comfort to those who mourn and strength to those working diligently to care for affected communities.

Give: Your gifts will support earthquake survivors. Gifts to "[Haiti Crisis](#)" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the earthquake in Haiti.
