We proclaim that God has created the diversity of humankind in God's image and we are all equal and beloved children of God. 

- **Green- low** Masks optional and **respected**, Communion with bread & individual cups
- Yellow- medium Masks recommended, Communion with bread and individual cups
- Red- high The CDC recommends indoor masking at this level, Masks required in worship,
 Communion with pre-packaged servings, Masks encouraged in the building, may be removed with the consent of all present

At all levels:

- If you test positive for COVID or aren't feeling healthy, stay home and join in worship online.
- If you have been exposed to COVID-19 but have tested negative, wear a mask in worship until ten days after your exposure even if you are vaccinated and boosted.
- Fellowship Hour will continue through the spring and summer, even in red, unless the Congregation Council determines it should be suspended. People are welcome to take coffee and treats outdoors.
