- **Reader:** Reads scriptures during the service. Meets with Presiding Minister at 9:10 am to review service flow.
- **Cantor**: Leads congregation in singing the Kyrie, Psalm, and acclamations during the service. Meets with Presiding Minister at 9:10 am to review service flow.
- Ushers: Arrive at 9:10 am to greet worshippers. Passes and presents offering plates. Guides flow to Communion. Counts offering and drops at bank deposit box following service. 2-hour commitment
- **Fellowship**: Preparation and service set up of coffee and treats for the Fellowship Hour following the worship service. Clean up of Fellowship Hall and Kitchen after the dishwasher is ready for use or paper products are available for serving.
- Video: Turns the recording and audio equipment on and off at the beginning and end of worship. Changes the camera direction with the remote.
- Youth Programming: Serve as a support and positive presence in the room for the teachers and youth.
