ADVENT EVENING PRAYER- WINTER SOLISTICE-LONGEST NIGHT This week we continue our series on Opening to Holy Disruption with the final practice of *rejoicing*. On the longest night, in a season that can be difficult for many, we'll practice opening to God's gift of joy- joy that is not dependent on our circumstances and not up to us to manufacture. You can join this practice at home. Begin with 3 deep breaths. Then, on an inhale, close your fists. On an exhale, open them and raise your hands in a gesture of offering and thanksgiving. Try this 3 times.
