GATHERING

We light a new fire that reminds us of God's eternal presence.

WELCOME

Beloved of God, this is the night!

This is the night in which our Savior passed from death to life. On this most holy night we join with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer. We gather at a fire as the sun sets. From this fire, we light the Paschal candle - a new flame for a new beginning, a sign that the light of Christ cannot be contained in a tomb. We tell stories of God's faithfulness throughout history. We wait for and then celebrate Christ's Passover from death into life. The first Alleluias of Easter are sung in the dark night of the Vigil, assuring us that hope begins in the dark.

Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we too pass from death to life. Tonight, we affirm our baptismal identities. Then, with the whole church, we share the meal of the Risen Christ who was made known to his grieving disciples in the breaking of bread.

The grace of Christ Jesus, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.** Let us pray...**Amen.**



You have made public profession of your faith.


Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

With this bread and cup we remember our Lord's Passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


O God...Grace our table with your presence. Come, Holy Spirit.



RACIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT: This Statement was approved at the annual meeting of the congregation on February 6th, 2022. It was developed through the work of the Antiracism Team which held listening sessions with the congregation. When we fail, we will rely on God's grace, that God might work in and through our broken humanity and that we might be sustained to learn from our mistakes and continue to show up for the work of antiracism. (2 Corinthians 5:17-18)

We commit to listen, learn, and act with courage, kindness, respect, and humility as we practice antiracism both individually and as a congregation. (Galatians 5:22)

We publicly declare that we will actively pursue racial justice in all aspects of our congregational life and make changes to adopt antiracist policies and practices around worship, education, advocacy, stewardship, governance, and through our community partnerships and relationships.
