

WORD

FIRST READING: Acts 7:55-60

⁵⁵Filled with the Holy Spirit, [Stephen] gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶"Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" ⁵⁷But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. ⁵⁸Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." ⁶⁰Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died. - Word of God. Word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

PSALM 31:1-5, 15-16 Psalm 31 demonstrates faith in the face of trouble and woe. The psalmist pours out their complaint, and then proclaims their complete confidence is God's faithfulness. Verse 5 is especially beautiful and has been part of the service of Compline – the church's bedtime prayer – for centuries.

²Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—³if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. ⁴Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." ⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner."

⁸and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.- Word of God. 

FLOCK KICK-OFF TODAY! Shepherds and their Flocks will meet in various areas of the Church during Fellowship Hour. The creation of seven Flocks is part of an initiative approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting and implemented by the Congregation Council and Stewardship Committee. Flocks are intended to help everyone get to know each other better,

connect with and care for each other, and care for our congregation's worship and fellowship ministry. Everyone at Good Shepherd is included and welcome in a Flock and invited to this start-up event!

HIRING: GOOD SHEPHERD OFFICE & BUILDING MANAGER: The Office and Building Manager serves the hospitality and informational needs of the congregation; and tends to the function and well-being of the office and the building. The Office and Building Manager works collaboratively with both the Pastor and the Ministry-Communications Coordinator. Pay is \$15-\$17 per hour (commensurate with experience). Position is part-time, 15 hours per week. A complete job description and instructions for applying are on the website under "Contact Us — Job Postings".

FELLOWSHIP HOUR SIGN-UP: In an effort to open the space for more ways to get involved with Fellowship Hour, the sign-up process has changed, as well as the options for how to help make it happen. You can now sign-up to: make coffee & set-up, serve & clean-up, or provide treats. There are also blue collection bins for food/drinks in the kitchen where items can be dropped off at any time! You can sign up for each task if you want to, or just sign-up for what you want to do. In order for Fellowship Hour to happen, there needs to be a minimum of 1 coffee & set-up person, and 1 serve &clean-up person.

MOWING HELP NEEDED: It takes a village to maintain the grounds at Good Shepherd and we are requesting your help! The sign-up and full instructions are on the website under "Sign-Ups" and on the table in the Gathering Space. Good Shepherd provides all equipment needed. New to mowing at Good Shepherd? Here are the quick facts:

- Lead person will get in contact to set up a time to mow during the week.
- Mow on Thursday, Friday, or Saturday after 3pm on Thur. and Fri. to respect the Kinderhaus School which concludes at the end of May.
- For orientation to the equipment please contact Jim Fritz, Bob Wilson, or Lance Wood. If you have equipment questions/need gas contact Jim.
- Mow only when the grass is dry and keep the mower height at 3.0 inches.
- The mowing shed lock code is on the paper sign-up in the Gathering Space.
- Stay away from the construction zone and watch for hoses to trees move the hoses, do NOT mow over them.

Decorah Chorale presents "Love: A Wild Force": The Decorah Chorale will present a spring concert Sunday, May 7 at 3 p.m. in the Decorah High School Auditorium. The concert program, titled "Love: A Wild Force," includes sacred music, thematic music that celebrates new love and setting love free after death, and honors those who have stood tall in the face of adversity. A free-will offering will be taken to support the mission of the Decorah Chorale. The Decorah Chorale is an adult mixed choral ensemble with members from Decorah and surrounding communities.

CHORAL BENEFIT CONCERT: The annual concert featuring the Luren Singers, the Luther College Norskkor, High School & Middle School singers will be held on May 7th at Decorah Lutheran Church at 7:00 PM. In past years this concert has occurred on Mother's Day, but this year it is one week earlier on May 7th. This special concert features singers as young as twelve years of age and up to singers in their eighties. The free-will offering will be devoted to Humanitarian Aid for Ukraine and the Decorah Food Pantry.

FOOD PANTRY LITTLE FREE LIBRARY: The Decorah Food Pantry is beginning a Little Free Library to provide books for preschool-teens who visit the pantry with their parents. They are collecting used children's books in good condition, or cash/check donations. \$5.00 will buy 20 paperbacks at the Depot! Bins and an envelope for money are available in the Gathering Space. You can also place money labeled in the church office and we will get it to the Pantry.
