FIRST READING: Genesis 1:1-2:4a

The Story of Creation

1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

² The earth was barren, with no form of life; it was under a roaring ocean covered with darkness. But the Spirit of God was moving over the water.

The First Day

³ God said, "I command light to shine!" **And light started shining.** ⁴ God looked at the light and saw that it was good. [God] separated light from darkness ⁵ and named the light "Day" and the darkness "Night." **Evening came, then morning—that was the first day.**

The Second Day

⁶ God said, "I command a dome to separate the water above it from the water below it." ⁷ And that's what happened. God made the dome ⁸ and named it "Sky." Evening came, then morning—that was the second day.

The Third Day

⁹ God said, "I command the water under the sky to come together in one place, so there will be dry ground." And that's what happened. ¹⁰ God named the dry ground "Land," and [God] named the water "Ocean." God looked at what [God] had done and saw that it was good. ¹¹ God said, "I command the earth to produce all kinds of plants, including fruit trees and grain." And that's what happened. ¹² The earth produced all kinds of vegetation. God looked at what [God] had done, and it was good. ¹³ Evening came, then morning—that was the third day. The Fourth Day

¹⁴ God said, "I command lights to appear in the sky and to separate day from night and to show the time for seasons, special days, and years. ¹⁵ I command them to shine on the earth." And that's what happened. ¹⁶ God made two powerful lights, the brighter one to rule the day and the other to rule the night. [God] also made the stars. ¹⁷ Then God put these lights in the sky to shine on the earth, ¹⁸ to rule day and night, and to separate light from darkness. God looked at what [God] had done, and it was good. ¹⁹ Evening came, then morning—that was the fourth day.

The Fifth Day

²⁰ God said, "I command the ocean to be full of living creatures, and I command birds to fly above the earth." ²¹ So God made the giant sea monsters and all the living creatures that swim in the ocean. [God] also made every kind of bird. **God looked at what [God] had done, and it was good.** ²² Then [God] gave the living creatures [God's] blessing—[God] told the ocean creatures to increase and live everywhere in the ocean and the birds to increase everywhere on earth. ²³ **Evening came, then morning—that was the fifth day.**

The Sixth Day

²⁴ God said, "I command the earth to give life to all kinds of tame animals, wild animals, and reptiles." And that's what happened. ²⁵ God made every one of them. Then [God] looked at what [God] had done, and it was good.

²⁶ God said, "Now we will make humans, and they will be like us. We will let them rule the fish, the birds, and all other living creatures."

²⁷ So God created humans to be like [God's] own self [God] made men and women. ²⁸ God gave them a blessing and said:

Have a lot of children! Fill the earth and take charge. Be responsible for the fish in the ocean, the birds in the sky, and every animal on the earth.

²⁹ I have provided all kinds of fruit and grain for you to eat. ³⁰ And I have given the green plants as food for everything else that breathes, including animals, both wild and tame, and birds. **And so it was.**

³¹ God looked at what [God] had done. All of it was very good! Evening came, then morning—that was the sixth day.

¹So the heavens and the earth and everything else were created.

The Seventh Day

² By the seventh day God had finished [God's] work, and so [God] rested. ³God blessed the seventh day and made it special, because on that day [God] rested from [God's] work. **4That's how God created the heavens and the earth.**


Mothering God, You Gave Me Birth



RACIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT: This Statement was approved at the annual meeting of the congregation on February 6th, 2022. It was developed through the work of the Racial Justice Team which held listening sessions with the congregation. A portion of the Statement is printed here each week. We lament that the white Church in the United States, through its dominant place in our country's culture and history, has actively constructed, justified, and sustained systems of racial injustice and violence. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has marginalized Lutheran Black, Indigenous, and People of Color leaders and communities and perpetuated a patriarchal, monocultural and racially segregated status quo. (From Declaration of the ELCA to Peoples of African Descent issued by ELCA Church Council, June 27, 2019)

We trust in the new life made possible through Christ's resurrection and we are hopeful that the Church is an ideal place to engage in the lifelong and transformative work of racial justice. Fostering antiracist ideas and actions is one way that we can follow Jesus' example of love for our neighbor. When we fail, we will rely on God's grace, that God might work in and through our broken humanity and that we might be sustained to learn from our mistakes and continue to show up for the work of antiracism. (2 Corinthians 5:17-18)

We publicly declare that we will actively pursue racial justice in all aspects of our congregational life and make changes to adopt antiracist policies and practices around worship, education, advocacy, stewardship, governance, and through our community partnerships and relationships. (Ephesians 2: 14-15, Isaiah 56: 6)
