



It was determined that the history and mission of the Fisk Jubilee Singers would make their organization very appropriate partners in this endeavor, and the congregation set aside a portion of the annual budget for reparations royalties. The Worship and Music Committee encourages all members to sign a letter to the Fisk Jubilee Singers in the Gathering Space today, which will be accompanied with a check for \$650 (\$500 budgeted and a \$150 member gift).
