SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3, 9:30 a.m. - FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

- The Season of Advent begins today! *Dancing, Dreaming, and Singing in the Darkness* is our overall theme for worship on Sundays and Wednesdays, with an emphasis on **Dreaming** on Sundays. (See the Advent section below for more information.)
 - From Pastor Amy: God's dreamers do not fall asleep to the realities of the world. God prompts us to pay attention to where God's dreams for change and new life are emerging. In Advent, we remember that God's ultimate dream is to be intimately connected to us—to come down and dwell among us. As we keep awake, we join Isaiah and the psalmist in pleading for restoration and for God to draw near. (from A Sanctified Art, Those Who Dream 2021)
 - The first candle on the Advent Wreath will be lit by a family.
- Pastor Amy will preside and preach. Assisting Minister is Rev. Rolf Svanoe; Reader is James Barth; Ushers and Greeter are the Cote family (Dustin, Heather, Mason, and Weston). All are members of the Purple Flock, led by Shepherds Tom and Connie Buresh. Cantor is Jonathon Struve.
- Blessing for Caretakers: The Worship and Music Committee is offering blessings for our vocations each month. Today we offer a blessing for all caretakers: those who are employed to care for others as well as parents, family caregivers, and those who volunteer to provide care.

ADVENT BEGINS THIS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3

- The **Season of Advent** begins on Sunday, and this year's theme for Sundays and Wednesdays during Advent is *Dancing, Dreaming, and Singing in the Darkness.*
 - Sundays in Advent, our theme is Dreaming in the Darkness.
 - The prophets, the psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, the shepherds, and the Magi—they were all dreamers. They received, discovered, and responded to God's dreams for the world. In Advent, we step into the mystery and awe of God's dreams and pray they shape our reality. This theme is for the dreamers in all of us—those who dream of a deeper connection with God and those who dream of a better world. It's for those who dream of comfort and for those who have given up on their dreams. It's for those whose dreams have been crushed and for those who show us that dreams take time. Together, we seek and sow God's dreams for our world. (from A Sanctified Art's, Those Who Dream, 2021)

CALL PROCESS UPDATE

- On November 14, the Congregation Council, Pastor Amy, and Good Shepherd staff met with Pastor Liz Bell of the Northeastern Iowa Synod. Pastor Bell will work with Good Shepherd on the call process going forward. Also, the Synod shared with the Executive Committee the name of a potential Intentional Interim Pastor.
- This week, the Executive Committee of the Congregation Council, along with Brooke Joyce, Music Director, is scheduled to meet with a pastor candidate to serve as Good Shepherd's Intentional Interim Pastor. The interim pastor would begin service after January 7, 2024.
- The Council is following the procedure outlined by our Good Shepherd constitution: the Executive Committee will make a recommendation to the Council of an interim candidate; when the Council votes to consent, the bishop of the synod appoints the recommended interim.
- The Work ahead: the Council will work to establish a Call Committee composed of 6 voting members of the congregation. According to Section C13.04. of our Constitution, the Call Committee is composed of 6 voting members of the congregation elected by the Congregation Council.
- The work of the Call Committee is outlined in detail by our Synod; these procedures have been shared with Council and digitized by Tristan for the use of the Call Committee. Pastor Liz Bell of the NEIA Synod will accompany the Call Committee in its work.
