


Everlasting God,

**CALL PROCESS UPDATE:** Establishing a transition team is on hold as its role depends upon whether there is an interim pastor. A call committee will be formed by the annual meeting on Feb. 4. There is a detailed outline of the call process in the December Newsletter and as a handout in the Gathering Space.

- Last week, the Executive Committee of the Congregation Council, along with Brooke Joyce, Music Director, met with a pastor candidate to serve as Good Shepherd's Intentional Interim Pastor. The interim pastor would begin service after January 7, 2024.
- The Council is following the procedure outlined by our Good Shepherd constitution: the Executive Committee will make a recommendation to the Council of an interim candidate; when the Council votes to consent, the bishop of the synod appoints the recommended interim.
- The Work ahead: the Council will work to establish a Call Committee composed of 6 voting members of the congregation. According to Section C13.04. of our Constitution, the Call Committee is composed of 6 voting members of the congregation elected by the Congregation Council.
- The work of the Call Committee is outlined in detail by our Synod; these procedures have been shared with Council and digitized by Tristan for the use of the Call Committee. Pastor Liz Bell of the NEIA Synod will accompany the Call Committee in its work.

We need all sizes, but our youth outdoor gear seems to be in the highest demand. There is a container outside the Good Shepherd sanctuary where you can drop off donations.
