

The Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ²asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." 3When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 6'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. 8Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." 9When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.





MISSION ASSISTANCE FUND DONATIONS STILL NEEDED: Good Shepherd's Mission Assistance Fund, set up to help people who need short-term emergency assistance, is almost depleted. DONATE TO GUATEMALAN BASICS PROGRAM: In this season of giving, the Northeast lowa Peace and Justice Center's Immigration Working Group is asking people to help our newly-arrived neighbors with a donation to the Guatemalan Basics program. This program provides 50 pound bags of rice and Masa (cornflour) and 25 pound bags of beans to newly arrived immigrants. One delivery, which costs about \$100, feeds a family of four for up to six weeks. This gives new families in the area time to get on their feet and ensures that no one in the family is hungry.
