### **SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23**





MUSIC NOTES FOR TODAY: Henry T. Burleigh (1866-1949) is best known today as an arranger of spirituals for voice and piano. Ignatius Sancho (1729-1780) was an African composer and author who grew up as a house slave in England. Florence Price (1887-1953) was the first black female composer featured by a major American orchestra (Chicago Symphony in 1933).
